

District Explorer Scout Report – 2019

2019 has flown by and as the year closes, we say goodbye to Allen Heath (who is stepping down as District Explorer Scout Commissioner to take up the role of District Network Scout Commissioner) and Denise Kilpatrick who has grown the Ray Mears Young Leader Unit since 2009 to over 60 members! We would like to take this opportunity to thank both Allen and Denise for their significant contributions to Explorer Scouting in Crawley. We also welcome several new volunteers to our team including Sean Edwards (District Explorer Scout Commissioner), Clair Pushman (Shackleton ESU), Jason Wilcox (SRF ESU), Simon Maddocks (Explorer Treasurer) and Shahzad Khokhar (Neil Armstrong ESU). There is always space for more volunteers so if you would like to join the volunteer team, please do get in touch!

In Crawley, there are 5 Explorer Units: Ray Mears (Young Leaders), Sir Ranulph Fiennes, Shackleton, Neil Armstrong and Drake. At the end of 2019, membership across these units totaled 92 Explorers including 59 Young Leaders.

Over the course of 2019, the units took part in a wide variety of activities including: 2 mountain activity weekends (**April** and **October**), **Fire and Ice Camp**, **Water Activities and Camps**, Bisley Scout Shooting Competition, Monopoly Run, Overland Hike, Downsman Hike and Summer Camps (Drake – North Wales, SRF ESU – Tolmers, Neil Armstrong – Bentley Copse). Four youth members and I also attended the **2019 World Scout Jamboree in America and Canada**.

Several Explorers throughout the year have also been awarded their Chief Scout Platinum Award (7) and Young Leader Belt Buckle (5).

Within the District we also offer the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme alongside the Scout Association progressive award scheme. Keith Prior is the D of E advisor and helps with the D of E at each unit when required. We currently have around 60% of Explorers enrolled into the D of E scheme. During the year the following were completed Bronze (12), Silver (4) and Gold (1).

Without the dedication and commitment from our volunteer leaders and supporters, none of this would be possible so a big thank you to all the leaders for your support over the course of 2019 and making me feel so welcome as the incoming District Explorer Scout Commissioner! I would also like to extend my thanks to the 59 Young Leaders that week on week support the younger sections to partake in a quality programme.

Let us continue as a team with confidence to provide excellent Scouting to our young people here in Crawley District.

We have ended 2019 with 13 adults not having achieved their Essential Information training, 27 completed the

learning but not validation and therefore 40 still in 'provisional' roles.

Mandatory Ongoing Learning; out of date = 21 First Aid; 12 Safeguarding; 12 Safety Awareness. Courses locally; First Aid 5MAR & 3APR, Safeguarding & Safety Awareness 7JUN – book via Eventbrite.

These achievements are achieved with the support of Training Advisers who help guide adults through the learning and validation process. Crawley has a reduced team of TAs again this year but my **unending gratitude** goes to: Carol Stevenson Denise Kilpatrick Graham Mitchell Ian Head Keith Prior Mick Hill Paul Masters Shona Graves Allen Heath Eddy Hills, on Management modules. Thanks to Helen Ives for support, Adam Jasko and Gregers Young for stepping forward and to all the GSLs who have supported their teams learning.

Training Adviser roles totally fulfil the criteria for flexible work hours ☺ requiring only a genuine interest in supporting adults progress their Scouting skills, communicating clearly and methodically. It **DOES NOT** depend on I.T. skills or piles of paperwork. If you are interested, please ask me.

Crawley District currently has 9 adults waiting on Management training, 64 leaders working through their Wood Badge and 23 Trustees needing Essential Information for Executive Members – much to do in 2020.

District Executive Report

During the year from January to December 2019 the Executive met five times.

We manage Stanford Camp site and share the management of Lark Rise HQ

Much of the discussion has centred around Stanford camp site. After a titanic struggle Electricity was restored to the main hut in late December, since then power has been restored to the Shower block and installed in the bunkhouse. Everything has been tested and passed and we are awaiting the official certificate from NICC when we will have to pay the final instalment of the bill bringing the total spend to £56k of which some £15k has come from District funds, mainly for the new connection to the bunkhouse.

The bunkhouse is still largely on hold awaiting an agreement with Building Control.

We have had a number of issues with the mowers and undertook a review as to the best way forward for maintaining the various areas. This demonstrated that the most cost effective was to continue with two ride on mowers with regular fortnightly and monthly mowing but with stricter controls on their use. We do need more volunteers to help with the grass cutting but they must undergo a familiarisation session before using the mowers.

Allen Heath has agreed to run a 100 club to support Stanfords for which we still need more members.

We have also discussed the trials and tribulations we have experienced in setting up new bank accounts with

Barclays Bank for all District sections and the transfer of the main District account from RBS to Barclays.

We also agreed to the disposal of the District van.

The need for more leaders to support our youth was also frequently discussed. More Adults in administration roles would allow leaders more time to concentrate on the young people.
